I am extremely disappointed to advise that this season with the lifting of COVID restrictions, we have had an increase in theft and damage to craft. We are continually losing tools that are required to conduct minor repairs on equipment. There have been two ski paddles stolen,

a new ski that should not have been used severely damaged, and several competition boards damaged. I would like to remind ALL members that competition craft is only for use during organised training sessions by proficient and financial bronze/SRC award holders, unless permission has been sought from the Board Captain (Rod Mergan) or Ski Captain (Karen Igoe). As a result, the Executive will be putting a motion to the members at the January General Meeting to install security cameras within the gear shed.

The club has been successful in securing a Community Building Partnership Grant from our State Member for The Entrance David Mehan. This grant will allow us to repaint the members toilets, the internal stairwell, replace flooring in the hallway and office, and update the furniture in the office.

We have also been successful in obtaining a grant from Central Coast Council to enable us to purchase a hoist for our wheelchair visitors to access our range of beach wheelchairs.

We have also purchased a new under bench fridge/freezer for the kitchen area from last year's Volunteer's Grant.

We have applied for a further Volunteer's Grant from Federal Member for Dobell and patrolling club member Emma McBride which will allow us to purchase new lawn mowing equipment for the caretaker to tidy up the area around the club.

The club has also submitted a grant to place an all-weather cover over the Kiosk, first aid room and emergency evacuation site, we will be informed of our success or otherwise in February.

The Village Kiosk Toowoon Bay has had overwhelming success and as a result is on a giant learning curve on how to manage and deal with this success. I thank all members who support Village Kiosk Toowoon Bay, Trish

and her team. Remember this is an extremely important part of the Club's income stream, the Kiosk makes money the Club makes money!
