### Toowoon Bay SLSC was founded in 1954

### **OBJECTS**

The Club is a Charitable Organisation established solely to be and to continue as such and to this end the Objects of the Club are to:

- a) Provide for the conduct, encouragement, promotion and administration of surf life saving throughout the Toowoon Bay SLSC and the community in which it is placed;

- d) At all times promote mutual trust and confidence between the Club, SLSCC, SLSNSW, Surf Life Saving Clubs, SLSA and the Members in pursuit of these objects;
- e) At all times act on behalf of and in the interest of the Members and surf lifesaving;
- f) Promote the economic and community service success, strength and stability of the Club, SLSCC, SLSNSW, Surf Life Saving Clubs, SLSA and surf lifesaving;
- g) Affiliate with and otherwise liaise with SLSCC, SLSNSW and SLSA in the pursuit of these objects and surf lifesaving;
- h) Conduct, encourage, promote, advance and control surf lifesaving in Toowoon Bay SLSC, its many aspects devoted to aquatic safety and management and the preservation of life in the aquatic environment;
- i) Conduct or commission research and development for improvements in methods of surf lifesaving and surf lifesaving equipment and in all ways to improve and safeguard the use of the aquatic environment;
- j) Use and protect the Intellectual Property Guidelines;
- k) Apply the property and capacity of the Club towards the fulfilment and achievement of these objects;
- l) Promote the involvement and influence of surf lifesaving standards, techniques, awards and education with bodies involved in lifesaving;
- m) Strive for Governmental, commercial and public recognition of the Club as the authority on aquatic safety and management in the community in which it is placed;
- n) Promulgate, and secure uniformity in, such rules as may be necessary for the management and control of surf lifesaving and related activities and the preservation of life in the aquatic environment;
- o) Further extend the operations and teachings of the Club throughout Toowoon Bay SLSC and the community in which it is placed;
- p) Further develop in conjunction with the organisations referred to in (g) above, surf lifesaving into an organised institution and with these objects in view, to foster, regulate, organise and manage assessments, competitions, displays and other activities and to issue badges, medallions and certificates and award trophies to successful Members;
- q) Review and/or determine any matters relating to surf lifesaving which may arise, or be referred to it, by any Member;
- r) Pursue through itself or other such commercial arrangements (which are not in conflict with other SLS bodies), including sponsorship and marketing opportunities as are appropriate to further the interests of surf lifesaving in Toowoon Bay SLSC;
- s) Adopt and implement appropriate policies, including in relation to sexual harassment, equal opportunity, equity, drugs in sport, health, safety, junior and senior programs, infectious diseases and such other matters as arise from time to time as issues to be addressed in surf lifesaving;
- t) Represent the interests of its Members and of surf lifesaving generally in any appropriate forum in Toowoon Bay SLSC and the community in which it is placed;
- u) Have regard to the public interest in its operations;
- v) Undertake and or do all such things or activities which are necessary incidental or conducive to the advancement of these objects.

## Mick Cook "Cookie"

It is with profound sadness that we acknowledge the passing of Mick Cook, affectionately known as "Cookie" to all. Mick was a warm yet bold individual whose passion and dedication were evident in everything he undertook.

Mick Cook was widely respected and cherished for his extraordinary service to the community, particularly as a dedicated volunteer surf lifesaver for 25 years. Mick embodied the essence of lifesaving and embraced its guiding motto, "Vigilance and Service." A life member of the club, Mick was serving as Club President at the time of his passing, having held the position on five previous occasions and the role of Club Captain six times previously.

Over the years, Mick contributed extensively to numerous committees, was a trainer, assessor and served as Patrol Captain of Patrol 5. His commitment to lifesaving was unwavering, as demonstrated by his remarkable achievement of completing 100% patrol for the majority of his 25 years of volunteer service. In recognition of his dedication, Mick was awarded the National Medal and earned the 25-year clasp, highlighting his exceptional contributions.

Beyond his lifesaving duties, Mick was a true embodiment of the spirit of volunteerism. His willingness to assist was unparalleled—he would enthusiastically lend his support to community events, fundraising initiatives, carnival preparations, and programs such as the Stingray Nipper Program and the Clontarf Foundation. Among his many passions, Mick held ANZAC Day commemorations and the Toowoon Bay Ocean Swim closest to his heart, dedicating his time and energy to their success.

Mick carried out every task with generosity and a can-do attitude. For him, nothing was ever too much trouble. He exemplified the timeless adage: "Those who can, do. Those who can do more, volunteer" — author unknown.

Mick Cook leaves behind a legacy that will be remembered with respect, admiration, and gratitude by all who knew him. His contributions to the community and his selfless dedication will forever remain an inspiration.



Mick Cook Eulogy 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2025 Read by Greg Owen

I have been asked on behalf of Ruth and Cookie's family to say a few words about Cookie on behalf of Toowoon Bay SLSC. A few words won't even come close to describing Cookie and his Surf Club involvement, however, many of you already know of his contribution to the agency that he loved and devoted so much time to. As Cookie would say 'just do your best mate!'

My first knowledge of Cookie wansn't a personal connection with him, rather it was between him and my beautiful wife Bryn. After relocating to the Central Coast in 1999 and discovering Toowoon Bay, Bryn and her mate Cheryl went walking along the beach one day and while on that walk an IRB beached on the sand just near them. This bloke jumped out and said "g'day girls, wanna go for a ride in the duck?", to which they replied "errr, no thanks", to which he replied "come on, you'll be right. I got the Bride with me!", and so the two of them took him up on the offer and got a tour of the bay, Blue Bay and surrounding waters. When hearing this story later that night, I asked Bryn if her parents had taught her about not going anywhere with strangers!! But that, as I was to find out, was Cookie. Welcoming, always engaging with people with genuine warmth and wanting to showcase this community with everyone.

Cookie joined TBSLSC in 1999, attaining his Bronze Medallion and over the past 25 years served in many roles. Five times he served as, and is at this time the Club President, he served as Club Captain six times and is Patrol Captain of Patrol Five. Cookie also served on various sub committees and working groups, especially

around sourcing and securing funding from Government and private entities, often bringing all those stakeholders together as a united group. He was one of the first to volunteer to projects to enhance the surf club he loved. He was awarded life membership on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2017.

Cookie had a rare ability to bring people together. He made you feel good about volunteering and as a result you participated in and built strong ties with others within this community. Cookie would always highlight the common goal that we all share within this surf club and that's how he got you on board. His actions, at times, ruffled feathers and his "seek forgiveness not permission" attitude got positive results.

Family was important to Cookie, and Toowoon Bay Surf Club and many of its members were as an extended family to him.

Cookie and Ruth have attended many family functions of my own including our Lauren's wedding and the christening of Lauren's daughter.

Cookie, as you all know, was a funny bugger, every time I was with him, he made me laugh. He had his stock jokes, the infamous Peking Duck gag as an example, but he often made observations or found himself in situations that were bloody funny. If any of you have heard the bakers truck/duck incident, you'll know how funny Cookie thought that was and somehow the retelling got funnier. There was the infamous watermelon incident too. On Patrol 5 this particular day someone deposited a watermelon in the fridge and after sampling and recognising how rough it was, he decided to put it on dear Carole Bickley stating to her "geez mate that watermelon you've brought is rough!". Carole responded that it wasn't hers so Cookie can get stuffed! This became sport to Cookie, so he ribbed her about it throughout the day till in the end she picked it up and deposited it on Cookies head exclaiming "it's not my ....ing watermelon!". We all laughed so hard but not as hard as Cookie did himself.

Cookie loved to christen you too..... with a nickname. It wasn't always flattering either. Often it was in response to something you said or did, or some observation he made, maybe a joke at your expense or simply playing with your name:

The Bride, Ducky, Babe, Igloo, Average, Rissoles, Leaves, AbFab, Diddums, Precious, The Tall One, and Barbie to name a few. To my knowledge Cookie never let too much get under his skin. In a diverse community such as a surf club there is always differences of opinion. As our good mate Mark Everingham pointed out, Cookie demonstrated strong emotional intelligence and didn't let anything stick. Many times, when differing views were flying about and frustration ensued, I questioned his energy and resilience, and he would say "mate it's just an opposing opinion, don't worry about it!".

I have many stories about Cookie, but I think this demonstrates the man he was. As many of you would know Cookie lost his toes to diabetes and he tolerated many gags due to those losses. Losing his long toe, that is the one next to his big toe, he said, limited his footwear options.

I, for many years, coordinated the Toowoon Bay Ocean Swim and Cookie was always the first volunteer, rounding up others and controlling the water safety component of the event prior to and on the day. One year not too long ago, just prior to the 2K start with the wind picking up creating a fair chop on the water, a rising high tide and a lot of water moving in different directions, I went to Cookie and whaled into him in an expletive driven tirade about preparing and positioning water safety volunteers. After the event, without incident and feeling lousy about my behaviour to someone who has only ever supported me in everything I've done in this Club, I sheepishly went to Cookie and apologised for my unacceptable tirade. Cookie looked at me straight in the eye, looked down at his foot to where my gaze travelled also, and said "geez I miss my thongs!". And that was Mick Cook.

We will never be able to replace you mate, neither within this club nor within each of our lives. You have become so much to me, my family, your Patrol Five family and your Toowoon Bay family. Patrol Five, in particular Patrol Five debriefs, will never, EVER be the same without you.

Farewell my old mate and thank you for everything.

His absence has and will be profoundly felt within our club and the broader community. While we mourn this incredible individual, we also celebrate the joy and inspiration he brought into our lives. We will honour his memory by upholding the spirit and values he embodied. Mick took immense pride in our community-oriented, family centric club and serving as President was the icing on the cake for him.

In the interim, the remaining members of the Executive decided to continue operations and managing the Club, and I am serving as acting President. Mick would often say "do your best" and that remains our guiding principle.

I want to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to each member for your dedication and passion, which truly defines our community. Every one of you has made a meaningful contribution and had a significant impact. Let us continue fostering camaraderie and running the club smoothly in this new season and beyond.

Our patrol numbers remain strong, with well represented teams. The response from Nipper parents has been remarkable, with many completing their Bronze, first aid and higher awards, thereby strengthening our patrol teams. Many have also taken on the officials' courses ensuring our nippers are well prepared for carnivals. I am pleased to report that all water safety and official requirements are met by these committed parents.

There has also been significant commitment to skill building among our patrolling members. I would like to extend my thanks to our skilled trainers, assessors and facilitators for providing top notch training.

Lyn has become the second member from our organisation to be awarded life membership of SLSCC. This remarkable achievement is a testament to her dedication and contributions to the surf lifesaving community.

This season brought many achievements, with our primary goal of keeping the community safe on the beach accomplished – there were no lives lost here. Beyond our life saving efforts, we hosted several notable events and ongoing projects:



- Celebrated 70 year of lifesaving at TBSLSC with a beach party and display (information later in this report).
- o Completed the 'Heritage Walk'.
- o Hosted the World's Biggest Paddle Out attempt.
- Hosted another very successful Ocean Swim.
- Organised a trivia night for 100 members to foster connections between nipper families and the wider membership, supported by outstanding prize donations for our raffle.
- Hosted our first carnival in many years, which received praise from other clubs on the coast.
- Co-ordinated an excellent ANZAC Day commemoration, with attendance increasing despite the weather. We aim to continue incorporating our Rookies and younger members in reflecting on what ANZAC Day means to them.
- Hosted another very successful Biggest Morning Tea, with Wendy and her team raising over \$9,000 for the Cancer Council.
- Made significant progress with the clubhouse redevelopment plans, thanks to the efforts of the Building Committee (information later in this report).
- The Nipper BBQ enjoyed another successful season, and it's uplifting to see more nipper parents getting involved.

o Sunday SIPS continues to thrive, though slow in the winter, generating good revenue.

All these achievements are the result of our incredible volunteers! We are a community brought together not only by our love of the ocean but also by our shared commitment to service and community. The dedication and efforts displayed by all our members are truly remarkable. ### DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT - 2024/2025

This season has seen a turn around in our overall profitability with a small deficit of \$4,296 for the season after our record surplus of \$172,776 in the previous season.

There was always going to be a big downturn in the financial result following the large grants received in the previous season. This has also seen us complete our Heritage Walk, celebrate our 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary, and write off the old swimwear, having been replaced with an outsourced provider. We have also experienced increases in non-cash expenses related to depreciation with the increased asset base and employee benefit accruals.

While the overall result is a deficit, we have managed to maintain a positive cash flow result and expect to see an improvement in our result in the coming season without these one-off expenses.

### **GRANTS**

We were extremely lucky to obtain \$19,000 in funding from the Central Coast Council to assist us in putting on a 'Party on the Beach' to celebrate our 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It was a great day with bands, a static demonstration of life saving over that time and the launch of our recently completed Heritage Walk.

We received a package of obstacle equipment from the SLSA Inclusive Beaches Equipment grants proudly supported by **etrainu** (the SLSA Learning Management System provider).

The Club Lifesaving Equipment Grant (CLEG), proudly funded by the NSW Government and facilitated by Surf Life Saving NSW, was once again available to all NSW Surf Life Saving Clubs. The CLEG aims to provide financial assistance to each club to promote maintaining and upgrading operation gear and equipment items which are essential to lifesaving operations. The amount of \$2,118 was allocated to Toowoon Bay SLSC for the purchasing of the following lifesaving equipment:



- 3 x pulse oximeters
- A fuel cell for the IRB
- 2 x little baby QCPR manikins
- High power binoculars

Surf Life Saving's mission is to save lives, create great Australians and build better communities. To support its

mission, the Australian Government provided support to the organisation to ensure that Australia's Surf Life Saving Clubs are better equipped to assist in saving lives and reducing risk as well as the nation's coastal drowning toll.

The Australian Government, through the Beach Safety Equipment Fund (BSEF), has provided funding to purchase vital safety equipment since 2013. This funding package has since been extended to 2025 through the Water and Snow Safety Program. The Australian Government must be acknowledged for this initiative which provided \$11,000 in funding to TBSLSC for the purchase of vital safety equipment listed below:



### CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER'S REPORT -2024/2025

It is with great pride that I present the Chief Training Officer's report for the 2024/25 season. This year has been another strong one for the development of our Club's lifesaving capabilities, with a focus on high-quality training delivery, improved member engagement, and strengthening our operational readiness.

### **Achievements and Certifications:**

Unfortunately, due to ongoing issues with the Assessing App, recording of awards and requalification's, providing accurate numbers is impossible. Needless to say, they are higher that what is indicated.

### New Awards Delivered:

- Bronze Medallion: 16 members successfully obtained their Bronze Medallion and a group of 9 having been successfully assessed, however the processing has been unfortunately delayed. These candidates' names will be reflected in the 2025/26 Annual Report.
- o Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC): 15 new SRC holders
- First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART): 15 and 8 respectively members accredited
- o **IRB Crew:** 9 candidates successfully completed the crew course, and a group of 8 candidates have been successfully assessed, however (again) the processing has been delayed. These candidates' names will be reflected in the 2025/26 Annual Report.
- Silver Medallion IRB Drivers: 9 and counting with a new course starting in August.
- Proficiency Requalification (Skills Maintenance)

 Under 50% of active patrolling members were marked as having completed their annual proficiencies due to poor management of the Assessing App. It is hoped that SLSA improves this system for the new season.

### **Training Highlights:**

### Youth Development:

- Collaborated with the Junior Activities Committee to integrate more transition pathways from Nippers to SRC training.
- Conducted joint water and land-based training sessions for Under 14's preparing for their SRC.

### • Trainer Development:

 One new trainer and one new assessor have been endorsed or upgraded their qualifications.

### **Challenges:**

### • Trainer Availability:

Like many volunteer-run clubs, trainer availability remains a balancing act. Thanks to all
who stepped up and gave extra time to support the training groups with their skill
development and the TBSLSC Assessors who gave their time to conduct the assessments
and complete the required paperwork.

### • Weather Disruptions:

 Several planned sessions were rescheduled due to poor weather conditions or unsafe surf, impacting the training calendar.

### **Future Goals and Initiatives:**

### 1. Engaging Juniors:

 The Club aims to keep Juniors engaged through dynamic training approaches, providing younger members with training days, real life scenarios, and professional training introductions across advances skills such as SMAR, IRB and RWC.

### 2. Patrol Readiness:

 The Chief Training Officer (CTO) plans to work with Patrol Captains to tailor skill refreshers around the operational needs of their patrols, offering training during patrol times.

### 3. Club Training Days:

 Introducing club training days where all patrolling members are invited to attend skillspecific training sessions run by TBSLSC trainers, such as board and tube skills, resuscitation refreshers, and patrol scenarios.

### 4. Advanced Awards Participation:

Increasing participation in advanced awards (IRB Driver, Advanced First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, Patrol Captain etc)

### 5. Pre-Season Prep Programs:

 Introducing structured pre-season prep programs to lift fitness and readiness, including pre-season re-quals.

### 6. Transition Programs:

o Encouraging more SRC holders to transition to Bronze Medallion training through mentorship and dedicated transition programs.

### 7. Advanced IRB Skills:

Focusing on advanced IRB crew and driving skills.

### 8. Rookie Trainers Program:

o Establishing a Rookie Trainers Program designed for Rookies to train Nippers in surf skills.

### 9. Member Feedback:

Improving feedback from members regarding training and upskilling.

### 10. Patrol Scenario Challenge:

o Introduce a Patrol Scenario Challenge to be carried out during patrols.

These initiatives aim to enhance member engagement, improve training quality, and ensure the Club's operational readiness.

A massive thank you to our dedicated trainers, assessors, and facilitators who have made this season a success. Your knowledge, time, and commitment to lifesaving education is invaluable. Thanks also to the Executive Committee, Patrol Captains, and parents who supported our members through their training journey.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank our sponsors and supporters for their generosity and commitment. I would also like to acknowledge SLSCC, SLSNSW, SLSA, NSW and Federal Government for funding received. It is with this funding support that we can continue to provide good quality training through upto-date training resources, ensure our FA room and bags are adequately supplied, our members have adequate and varied equipment use in educational training as well and training for competition and our on beach capabilities are guaranteed, and our equipment is properly maintained.

### Mid North Coast Flood Response supported by Volunteer Lifesavers

TBSLSC patrolling member Craig Mueller-Ahsmann and surf lifesavers from across the state responded to the extreme weather event which affected the Mid North Coast in May, lending support to NSW SES and other emergency service agencies in rendering assistance to flood ravaged communities in the area. In all, 35 lifesavers across 10 teams of three and four, comprising of in-and on-water flood operators, UAV pilots and team leaders, took on missions including rescues, welfare checks, food resupplies, clean ups and intel gathering.

Craig and his strike team Sierra were deployed to Taree and the surrounding area with his team conducting welfare checks on residents cut off by flood water utilising IRB's and Archangel rafts, they conducted surveys of flooded roads and tagged abandoned cars in flood water. They also supported isolated communities and conducted medical drops and helped resupply essential items. Craig was involved in the rescue and recovery of a police officer and his vehicle which had become stuck on a flooded road. His team also supported the community at Kempsey by operating a ferry service of IRB's to transport people across flood water to access supplies and for essential workers (nurses, paramedics etc) to get to work.

### TOOWOON BAY SLSC 70TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

During 2023, it was determined that Toowoon Bay SLSC would celebrate its milestone 70<sup>th</sup> and the idea was that there would be a birthday party on the beach.

Director of Finance Karen Hickmott successfully secured two grants: one from the Central Coast Council's Events Team to help with the cost of holding the event. The other from Member for The Entrance David Mehan.: to assist with the renovation of the club's foyer area and stairwell, which now proudly showcases the club's rich history. Additionally, it was resolved to formally recognise the clubs outstanding achievements in surf sports.

The stairwell and foyer have been refurbished and transformed into the 'Heritage Walk'. A lifesaving service board has been installed in the foyer, featuring the names of members who have patrolled for a minimum of 10 years, alongside a board honouring those who have achieved meritorious distinction. This project was managed and curated by Lyn Lewis, with historical research conducted by Lyn Waters.

The 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations was planned to serve as a comprehensive showcase of 70 years of lifesaving, culminating in a celebration on the beach.

As detailed in the program below, the first part of the day included a static display featuring the various forms of rescue equipment, ranging from 1954 to present day. This exhibit included items from the original rescue reel to the current drones. The intention was to capture a photograph in the water that featured all forms of rescue equipment from different decades, with the Westpac Rescue Helicopter hovering overhead. Our keen photographer TC managed to capture the intention.

Participants were selected based on their specific contributions, as outlined in the program. The reel team comprises the last five members of the Club who were required to carry out a belt rescue to successfully obtain their Bronze Medallion. Notably, the boat crew included Jeff Heyden an original member of TBSLSC's first surf boat medal winning team, and Dean Griffin, after whom one of the Club's boats is named.

The impressive stage and installation, made possible by club member Rob Shaw, contributed to the day's remarkable success. It was a joy to witness everyone dancing to the music pumped out by Shot they Boys, dancing on the sand and in the water. People came and enjoyed the music in the sun, enjoying a picnic on the sand. It was a picture-perfect day at Toowoon.



The 2024/25 season was the first for us as age managers for the Under 11's and was extremely successful in a number of key areas.

**ATTENDANCE** – we had a very strong contingent of nippers in regular attendance. A core group of 20-25 in attendance every week. Our female nippers out number the males by two to one, and it's great to see the engagement levels.

**SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND PARTICIPATION** – All our nippers have made significant improvements this year. The participation rates in both sand and water events improved each week as nippers became more comfortable with the introduction of fibreglass boards and the larger course for the swim and board. We also introduced some board and tube rescues this year as well as signals which was well received by the nippers. Our female nippers are a very competitive bunch, and their skill levels are on par with each other which creates a great competitive nature between them. It is very exciting to watch them compete against each other every week. Our male nippers remained extremely consistent throughout the season, willing to give anything a go.

**FRIENDSHIPS AND SUPPORT** – A highlight for this season has been watching the group grow together. They are extremely supportive of each other, they will always stand and cheer each other along. 

- Rookie Camp at Point Wolstoncroft


- Rookie Challenge at Umina

We also ran Sunday sessions before Nippers with Matt which was also very popular, these sessions were more fundamentals of flags and relay based and will definitely be on the calendar next season.

With some outstanding beach competitors, we were able to bring home a swag of medals from all the carnivals we attended with some great results reached at Branch Championships.

A great initiative from Luke was having 'focus' carnivals. This enabled us to make sure we took the strongest team possible and also make sure we could fulfill our water safety and official obligations.

## **FUNCTION ROOM - 2024/2025**

This year, our event area (or Multifunction Community Area) has seen a shift in bookings towards hourly rates rather than full-day rentals, with the majority of events being birthday celebrations (70<sup>th</sup>'s particularly), baby showers and wakes. The cost to hire the area remains static, allowing us to maintain affordability. Regular weekday bookings for Pilates, Breathwork, Yoga and Sound Healing remain consistent. These regular weekday bookings generate a secure income stream. Our area is still the preferred space for Central Coast Council to have their offsite meetings and I'm always pointing out the whales to their amazement. We also welcome a group of Japanese students, facilitated by SLSCC, to learn surf safety.

Our Sunday SIPS continues to generate good, reliable income for the club. I think we've accomplished providing a welcoming, friendly, family centric atmosphere and guests that have recently moved to the area express their joy in finding such a lovely club and group of people. To enhance the experience over the winter months, I have added lamps to create a warm ambiance instead of relying on the harsh overhead lighting that detracted from the warm atmosphere.

Additionally, we are planning to replace the worn table tops. In the interim, I have sourced Lycra tablecloths from Temu to cover the existing tables, ensuring that our space remains presentable until the new tops are installed.

Regarding entertainment, we have decided to suspend the monthly band performances during the winter season, as the attendance of regular attendees did not justify the associated costs. However, SIPS will continue throughout winter with the addition of special events such as Karaoke, Open Mic, and potentially a pie afternoon. The October long weekend will mark the launch of our 'Sunshine Soirees,' featuring the ever-popular Breakaways performing on Monday, October 6th. Additionally, new bands will be included in the lineup, and similar to last year, we will host bands on three Sundays in January.

I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to Ben and Karen, who dedicate their time each week to sort the glasses, manage the recycling, unload/reload fridges and handle the return and earn bottles/cans. Their efforts are greatly appreciated and play a significant role in assisting me with managing the area. Additionally, I want to thank the licencee Christi, Bar Manager Tracey and the group of volunteers who assist in manning the bar every Sunday for SIPS. Their invaluable support is essential to the success of this event and contributes significantly

to the club's revenue. Leigh is eager to help wherever he can, let him know if you see anything around the club that needs attention.

Full day hire is still \$1,800.00 with a \$1,500.00 bond also charged along with after cleaning at \$250.00 and one security guard at \$250.00 for the evening. Hourly rate remains at \$132.00/hour with a minimum booking of six hours. Wakes and Sundays negotiable. Due to recent increases in wage rates, the cost of our bar staff for events has also increased marginally.

# **Toowoon Bay SLSC Building Committee**

As most members are aware, the Club Executive determined in late 2019 that the current clubhouse is not fit for purpose and requires urgent refurbishment and extension work.

Several issues have been identified, including the lack of access for emergency services equipment, insufficient storage space, inadequate training space, and the inability for NSW Ambulance to access the First Aid room with their stretcher due to the narrow door. Additionally, the public toilet facilities are not accessible to beach wheelchair users, and there were inadequate facilities for bump-in/bump-out activities. These are just a few of the issues identified, along with a wide range of Occupational Health and Safety (OH&S) concerns. Despite having one of the largest memberships on the coast, the Club has the smallest clubhouse.

Over the ensuing years, the Club formed a committee and engaged all stakeholders in formulating a suitable design concept. The plans were submitted to Central Coast Council (CCC) last year for pre-development application (pre-DA) approval.

Council's asset manager requested the Club to conduct a public meeting earlier this year, and the feedback at that meeting was somewhat positive. As a result, CCC has asked the Club to hold private meetings with selected stakeholders. At the time of writing this report, these meetings were being organized.

Once these meetings have been conducted and reviewed, it is hoped that the project can move forward.
